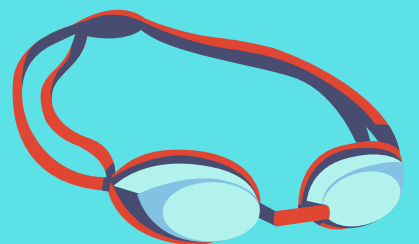
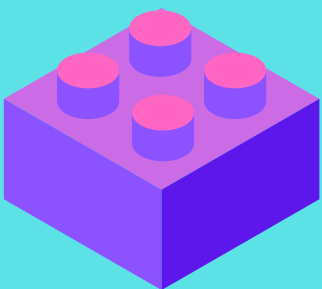


Hello Families,

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Policies & Procedures

Counselor to Camper Ratio

With over 100 campers, supervision for physical and emotional safety is pertinent. We implemented a 1:10 Staff to Camper ratio for 4K-5K campers and a 1:15 ratio for 1st-5th grade campers. Our counselors are trained in various de-escalation techniques, age-appropriate communication, and other training to be successful in our large group settings.

Check-in/Out, Attendance

Camper safety is our priority. We require ALL parents/guardians to drop off their child directly to a Program Aide, Assistant Director, or the Director. The staff member must check-in the camper on CampDoc and confirm with their Camp Counselor of the camper's arrival.

Between 9:00 am-9:15 am, all Counselors must finish their attendance sheets for the Program Aide to cross reference attendance records. Any campers not recorded during drop-off and Counselor attendance sheet will have their parent/guardian called to confirm their absence. Furthermore, all groups must complete a "name-to-face" hourly in which they take attendance by visually seeing and audibly hearing the camper (in addition to all Counselors to be within sight and sound of their group at all times).

During our Check-out process, anyone picking up the camper must have their photo ID and be entered as a parent/guardian, trusted contact, or emergency contact. If you want your camper picked up by an adult not entered in CampDoc, please inform the Aide, Assistant Director, or Director of the adult's full name and date of birth and what day(s) they can are allowed for pick-up for that week. The adult must always have their photo ID to pick up. Parents/Guardians will be called if an unauthorized pick-up is being attempted.

Attendance Check - Field Trips

Field trips enrich learning for the campers while being a great getaway from the campsite! During field trips, name-to-face is required every 30 minutes from when campers begin their field trip process. With this, camp Leadership and Program Aides will do their attendance before departing the campsite and field trip location.

Swimming at Central

Certified lifeguards staff our pool time for the safety of all campers and staff. On various days and times, campers can swim in our indoor pool. In addition to this, our counselors are also supervising children within and outside the pool.

It is our policy for lifeguards to be on staff in order for camp to utilize the pool. We will only take campers to the pool and on swimming field trips if lifeguards are present.

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More Policies & Procedures

Incident & Accident Reports

During camp, incidences and accidents are inevitable. We have control over how we proactively prevent and reactively handle situations.

All major and minor incidences and accidents will be reported to the parent/guardian via CampDoc.

For incidences considered major reports (including but not limited to bullying, physical altercation, self-injury, and safety concerns), a phone call will be made to the parent/guardian by the Program Aide, Assistant Director, or Site Director.

Accident reports considered high-priority (including but not limited to allergic reactions, choking, and head injury), a phone call will be made to the parent/guardian by the Aide, Assistant Director, or Director.

Bullying & Harassment

Our commitment to safety is absolute. We do not tolerate bullying and harassment toward campers and staff members. Suspension or disenrollment from the program may occur depending on variables such as the situation, consistency, and willingness to change behavior. Campers and staff are here to produce holistic growth.

Lost & Stolen Items

All items brought to camp are the responsibility of the camper. We recommend not bringing any valuable items to camp. We also recommend labeling all items that are brought to camp. Unless stated otherwise, campers should not bring toys/electronics and money.

Medication/Application of Sunscreen

Medication will only be administered by a Program Aide, Assistant Director, or Site Director over 18 and trained for medication administration. Medication can only be administered with the proper paperwork on file at camp (see wawmsd.org-families-forms, for the proper paperwork) and the medication in its prescribed bottle with the campers name and dosage printed on the label. Camp staff will not administer any medications brought to camp in an unauthorized package (zip lock bag, wrong bottle, etc.). Any changes made to medication must be reported directly to the Program Aide, Assistant Director, or Site Director, alongside updated on CampDoc.

We require all campers to bring sunscreen of SPF 30+. Camp staff can assist your camper in this process by spraying sunscreen but cannot assist in rubbing sunscreen into their skin. Please take some time at home to ensure that your camper (especially 4K/5K) understands sunscreen application.

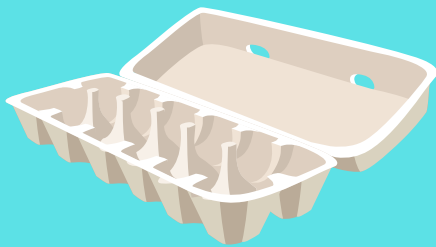

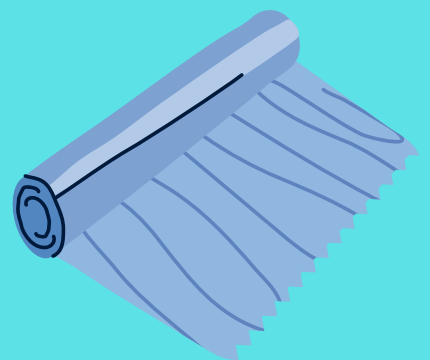
